Protect Yourself from the Latest Scam

"I received a phone call from Innovation asking me to press 5 for an urgent message. Or to text 9 to receive a verification link. Was this really you?"

Sound familiar? Members and non-members alike have made us aware of a scam where fraudsters are impersonating us.

This very common scam, called the "bank investigator" scam, is when fraudsters call thousands of numbers pretending to be a bank, credit card company, or other financial institution and hope by chance that you deal with that company.

It's probably easy to recognize these calls as a scam if you aren't a member or client of that company, but if you are a member or client, they can easily get you to click a link or push a button.

Rest assured; these fake calls aren't part of a data breach. It's just a common scam that's chosen to impersonate our organization in the New Year.

Remember:

- We would never call and ask you to push a button on your phone.
- We would never pressure you to set up twofactor authentication over the phone.
- You'll always speak to a real person if we call you; it would never be automated.

What are tariffs? How could they impact me?

With all the current discussions around trade and tariffs between the US and Canada, you might be wondering what tariffs are and how they could impact you.

Tariffs are essentially a tax on imported goods. These taxes increase the prices you and businesses pay for goods and services. As a result, you might notice changes in spending, trade flows, government revenue, and more. Additionally, you might find it harder to find or access key goods and services. It's important to note that although tariffs raise the prices of imports, they are actually paid by domestic consumers like you. In short, it's everyday people who are most impacted by tariffs.

How Tariffs Could Impact Your Daily Life

Cost of Living: If tariffs are imposed, you could potentially see a smaller selection of goods coming from the US. This might lead to an increase in the price of consumer goods, including groceries, appliances, and vehicles.

Employment: Tariffs may also affect key industries such as manufacturing, tourism, and transportation, which could lead to layoffs and an increase in the unemployment rate. With fewer people working and prices rising, the demand for restaurants and entertainment may also decrease.
